

Hong Kong Art Gallery Association Summer Programme 2023

Open Call for Young Local Art Talents for Galleries

With the objective to put together a project that focuses on the local art scene and creates a positive impact on the new talents within the community, the Hong Kong Art Gallery Association (HKAGA) is now calling for **emerging Hong Kong artists**, **curators and writers to engage with galleries** in the HKAGA Summer Programme 2023. Spanning four months from June to September, the programme gives participating galleries, artists, curators and writers the liberty to interpret the project their own way, and the writings will then be compiled by the HKAGA and published online and/or printed.

We welcome applications from artists, curators and writers for this project. Please find below the details of the three categories:

Artists

You will be taking over a participating gallery's space or part of that space for a showcase of your works. All disciplines shall be considered, including Visual Art, Sculpture, Ceramics & Pottery, Printmaking & Papermaking, New Media, Animation, Digital Art, Performance Art, Sound Art.

Writers

You will be writing an in-depth interview piece/review/guided discussion about a participating gallery's exhibition.

Curators

You will be working with artists on the curation of an exhibition at one of the participating galleries.

Eligibility & Requirements:

Artists, curators and writers who are:

- Young
- Emerging
- Physically in Hong Kong

Selection Procedure & Details:

Applications will be shared with all participating galleries for selection. The final results will be announced by early June.

Important Notes

- Project Period: June September 2023, with exhibitions starting latest by August.
- Galleries participating in the open call for artist/curator/writer shall pay the artist/curator/writer based on mutual agreement through direct negotiation in which the Association will not be involved.
- Participating galleries will be responsible for the execution, installation, production and logistics, as well as any involved costs of any exhibition/project collaboration conceived under this Summer Programme.
- HKAGA will provide support for social media promotion, webpage specifically designed for this project, and connection between the participating galleries and young talents.
